

You are ready to go to college and have chosen the University of Kansas. Maybe you are the child of a parent who did not go to college, you do not think you can

afford to go to KU, or you have other obstacles in your path to a college education. If so, there is a scholarship program just for you. It will help you understand how to make the transition from high school to college, provide a scholarship for four years, and help you make life-long connections with faculty and staff.

Eligibility Criteria

1. Students must have faced personal challenges or hardship.
2. Students must be residents of Kansas and current high school seniors.
3. Students must be admissible to the University of Kansas by
 - Achieving an ACT score of 21 or above, or an SAT score of 980 or above, or
 - Earning at least a 2.0 GPA on a 4.0-point scale in the Kansas Board of Regents curriculum, or
 - Ranking in the top one-third of their high school class.
4. Students must be entering freshmen for the upcoming fall term at KU.
5. Students must demonstrate financial need as determined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
6. Students whose parent(s) did not earn a 4-year college degree will receive priority consideration (first generation).

Application Procedures

Hixson Opportunity Award applications will be available online at www.scholarships.ku.edu/hixson.shtml or at your high school counselor's office.

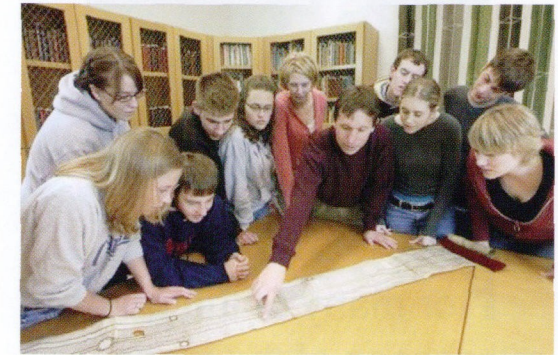
1. Submit the Hixson Opportunity Award application by February 1. Each application should include:
 - The application cover page.
 - An official high school transcript.
 - A list of leadership activities.
 - A letter of recommendation from your guidance counselor, teacher, or community leader.
2. Write an essay describing your potential to succeed and any personal challenges you faced that may hinder achieving these goals.
3. Complete the University of Kansas admission application process for the upcoming fall term at www.admissions.ku.edu by February 1.
4. Submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov by March 1 each year.
 - If you are unable to use completed income tax information, the FAFSA allows you to estimate income and submit corrections, if needed, after taxes are filed.



Recipient Expectations

The goal of the Hixson Opportunity Award is to engage students in existing programs on campus to help them navigate their college experience, including:

- Student support programs such as HAWK Link and Supportive Educational Services (SES)
- Hixson Scholars Seminar
- Hixson Scholars Mentors
- Community Service



Recipients also have the opportunity to participate in specialized programs:

- Academic Success Seminars
- Faculty & Staff Support Network
- Transitions Program
- Tutoring, Mentoring, and Academic Advising

Award Information

- Awards are available to entering freshmen who are Kansas residents and wish to study any major offered at the University of Kansas.
- Awards are \$5000 per year, renewable for a total of four years.
- Ten new award recipients will be selected per year.
- Recipients will be announced by April 1 of each year.
