

**U.S.D. # 374 Sublette High School
Access to Student Information by Military Recruiters**

**IMPORTANT – PARENTS READ & RETURN IF
APPROPRIATE**

Recognizing the challenges faced by military recruiters, Congress recently passed legislation that requires LEAs [local educational agencies] to provide to military recruiters, upon request, access to **Directory Information** on high school juniors and seniors. This legislation also requires that LEAs allow access to juniors and seniors, upon request, by military recruiters. Both the **No Child Left Behind Act of 2001** and the **National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2002** reflect these requirements. The effective dates of both provisions apply to all LEAs by no later than July 01, 2002.

The type of student information commonly referred to as “Directory Information”, includes such items as names, addresses, and telephone listings and is information **generally not considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if disclosed.**

The aforementioned provisions stipulate that the LEA [Sublette High School] must provide to the parents a notice of the types of student information released, upon request, to military recruiters.

Sublette High School, under the aforementioned provisions must release to military recruiters, upon request, student information commonly referred to as “Directory Information” as described above as names, addresses, and telephone listings.

If a parent opts out of providing directory information to military recruiters, the LEA [Sublette High School] **will not** release their student’s Directory Information.
